### **MASTER'S DEGREE REQUIREMENTS FOR INDIVIDUALS PREPARING TO BE REHABILITATION TEACHERS**

Entrance into the Program in Visual Impairment at the master's degree level may occur during any academic semester, but is recommended during the Fall.

Individuals participating in the Program in Visual Impairment at the master's degree level may design their own program, based on their personal interests and career goals.

#### **PROGRAM PREREQUISITES**

Because Florida State University offers a bachelor's degree program in the area of Visual Impairment, program participants who have not had the following core courses (or equivalents) must successfully complete the following classes during their master's degree work:

#### **PROGRAM PLANNING**

Master's degree students are required to take a minimum of 32 semester hours. Careful program planning is necessary to assure that the appropriate coursework and practicum experiences are taken. A Program of Study must be submitted and approved before the completion of 12 semester hours of work. Please consult with your advisor to assure that all requirements for the master's degree are met.

Students electing to become certified in both orientation and mobility and rehabilitation teaching must complete the following additional courses:
